Synopsis

L'Elisir D'Amore is a comic opera which unfolds in two acts.

One of the best loved of all Donizetti's operas, this two-act romantic comedy follows the fortunes of poor villager Nemorino who is in love with wealthy, beautiful heiress Adina.

She rejects him and travelling quack Dr. Dulcamara takes advantage of the desperate Nemorino, selling him a fake love potion which is really just red wine. Drunk on the wine, Nemorino feigns indifference to Adina and in her confusion, she agrees to marry the arrogant Sergeant Belcore.

Nemorino begs Dulcamara for another, stronger potion. The quack is only too happy to oblige. However, unbeknown to Nemorino and Adina, he has come into an inheritance and is now a wealthy man. The village women pursue him, and Adina's jealousy grows; does she love him after all?

The pair kiss and are caught in an embrace by Belcore. The wedding is off, the happy couple admit their feelings and Belcore shrugs it off, saying there are plenty of women in the world. Even Dulcamara is happy as his love potions appear to work and are suddenly in great demand.

Disproving the theory that opera must end in tragedy, they all live happily ever after.

Biographies

Pedro Barrera, Nemorino (11/9) - Colombian tenor Pedro Barrera, born in Barranquilla, moved to the United States in 2017 after receiving a full scholarship to do his Master's degree at the University of Denver's Lamont School of Music. Originally classified as a baritone, Barrera started transitioning to tenor in 2019. His tenor debut was that same year in Gianni Schicchi (Gherardo), and later on in Madama Butterfly (Goro), both performances took place at the Newman Center For The Performing Arts. In 2016 in Colombia, Barrera performed baritone roles with Opera de Colombia including in Fidelio (Second Prisoner), in La Cambiale di Matrimonio (Norton), and was also the baritone soloist for Duruflé's Requiem with the Bogota Youth Philharmonic Orchestra. Barrera was a national finalist of the Bogotá Philharmonic Orchestra Singing Competition in 2015 and 2016. Recent performances in the United States include Don Giovanni (Don Ottavio) in June of 2023 with Camerata Bardi - Teatro Grattacielo, Lucrezia Borgia (Vitellozzo) with New Amsterdam Opera in New York City, as well as La Traviata (Gastone) with New Jersey Lyric Opera.

Tiernan Chase, Adina (11/9) - Soprano Tiernan Chase earned a Master's degree from Manhattan School of Music. In 2019, Tiernan made her Italian debut in Verdi's *Rigoletto* (Gilda) as part of the Voce nel Montefeltro Festival in Novafeltria, Italy. She was scheduled to return there in the summer of 2020 to sing Verdi's *La Traviata* (Violetta Valery). Tiernan was scheduled to make her mainstage debut as the title role in Manhattan School of Music's Graduate Opera Theatre production of *Martha* in their 2020 Spring production. In 2021, Tiernan sang with the Brooklyn-based opera company The Opera Next Door in their inaugural performance of Mozart's *Così fan Tutte* (Despina). During the summer of 2022, Tiernan returned to Italy to make her role debut in the Voci nel Montefeltro Festival's production of *La Boheme* (Musetta). In the 2023 season, Tiernan made her Bronx Opera debut with her performance in their production of Kurt Weill's *Lady in the Dark* (Alison

Du Bois), and in Francis Poulenc's *Les Dialogues des Carmelites* (Soeur Constance). She appeared as a featured soloist for the United Nations Symphony Orchestra in December 2023. This is Tiernan's first production with Camerata Bardi/Teatro Grattacielo.

Alejandro de Los Santos, Dr. Dulcamara (11/8 & 11/9) - Alejandro De Los Santos is a Colombian Bass-Baritone specializing in Italian Opera and Spanish Zarzuela. He has performed internationally, including in Italy, France, Belgium, and the Czech Republic, as well as in various U.S. cities such as San Antonio, Great Barrington, and New York City, where he currently resides. Alejandro's recent achievements include his Carnegie Hall solo debut with the United Nations Chamber Ensemble, performing the role of Figaro at the Estates Theatre in Prague, and being part of the Grammy Award-nominated Trinity Wall Street Choir. Originally from Dover, NJ, Alejandro is deeply grateful for the support from his hometown community, which has been instrumental in his journey.

Valia Karagiorga, Gianetta (11/8) - Valia Karagiorga, an Athens native, seamlessly integrates her love for arts and science. Holding dual certifications in Adult and Child & Adolescent Psychiatry from the American Board of Psychiatry & Neurology, along with a medical license in New York. Valia is also a graduate of the National Theatre of Greece Drama School. Her musical journey commenced in a children's choir in 1996, evolving into classical and modern singing at Athens' Halandri National Conservatory and Filippos Nakas Conservatory from 1998 to 2009. She has additionally completed studies in dancing, freehand, and technical drawing. Spending seven years in New York City, Valia began studying classical singing under Stefanos Koroneos before returning to Greece in 2021. In addition to clinical and academic roles, Valia has performed at prestigious venues, including the National Theatre of Greece, the Greek National Opera, the Ancient Theater of Epidaurus. She has also participated in various concerts in Greece and New York. Recently, Valia adapted clinical stories from Dr. Nancy Davis's book, "Therapeutic Stories that Teach and Heal," into the original play "The Keys," currently premiering on a prominent stage in Athens. Valia embraces her dual roles as a psychiatrist and performer, expressing a sincere passion and dedication for both fields.

Yoonji Kim, Adina (11/8) - Soprano Yoonji Kim was born in South Korea. She graduated from the Yewon School and Seoul Arts High School, known as the prestigious arts school that produced musicians such as Heikyung Hong, and Sungjin Cho. She graduated Hanyang University *summa cum laude* where she also received a Dean's award and an excellence prize. She studied with Jungwon Park when she was

in Hanyang University. She continued her studies in Mannes School of Music obtaining her Master degree and is currently in Mannes pursuing a PDPL. She is studying with Arthur Levy and Joshua Greene. She was a semi-finalist in Premiere Opera Foundation Competition in 2022. In the summer of 2023, she made her debut in the opera *Hänsel and Gretel* (Gretel) in the Miami Music Festival.

Stefanos Koroneos, Director - As both General Director and Artistic Director of Teatro Grattacielo, Stefanos Koroneos brings a deep passion for multidisciplinary arts and creative vision to all his endeavors. His extensive experience as a performer gives him a unique perspective from the singer's point of view, allowing him to expertly draw out excellence from his collaborators. Koroneos is a skilled consensus-builder, effectively bridging artistic, collaborative, and administrative aspects to achieve outstanding results. Recent successes include the critically acclaimed curation and direction of Mozart's Idomeneo and Don Giovanni in Greece and the U.S, as well as his award-winning visual treatment of Zandonai's Giulietta e Romeo in Battery Park City, NY. In 2023-24 he reprised Don Giovanni, Madama Butterfly, Carmen, and La Vestale for Light Opera of New Jersey, La Tech in Monterrey, Mexico, the Cultural Center of Crete, the Megaron Thessaloniki and Teatro Grattacielo, I Am A Dreamer Who No Longer Dreams for Tri-Cities and Syracuse Operas, Carmen for Boheme Opera, Domme + Giovanni for White Snake Projects and L'Elisir d'Amore for Teatro Grattacielo. Upcoming productions include The Magic Flute for Tri-Cities Opera and the Luma Festival and the world premiere of Nicolas Flagello's Beyond the Horizon at La Mama in NYC. Mr. Koroneos has had the privilege of collaborating with some of the most renowned directors and conductors in the opera world, including Franco Zeffirelli, Fabrizio Melano, Moisés Kaufman, and Richard Bonynge. Through working with these esteemed artists, he has gained valuable insights and inspiration that have shaped his own unique directorial style, which continues to evolve and grow as he incorporates their expertise and vision. His international career as a baritone featured appearances with Teatro alla Scala, Teatro Regio di Torino, Bolshoi Theater, New York City Opera, Palm Beach Opera, Tampa Opera, Gotham Chamber Opera, Greek National Opera, Den Nye Opera Netherlands, Staatstheater Freiburg, Theater Osnabrück.

Bryan McClary, Belcore (11/8 & 11/9) - Bryan is recognized for his warm and rich baritone voice. He was recently a studio artist with Teatro Nuovo Covering the title role for their production of *Crispino e la*

Comare (Don Asdrubal) by the Ricci Brothers during their summer festival. Along side local productions Bryan has made his international debut in Greece performing with The Camerata Bardi Vocal Academy in Mozart's Don Giovanni (Masetto) and covering the title role. He will also be joining the Camerata in L'Elisir d'Amore (Belcore) by Donizetti. In 2020 Bryan received a Bachelors in Music from Westminster Choir College studying with Sharon Sweet and received a Masters in Music in 2023 from Indiana University's Jacobs School of Music studying with Peter Volpe.

Zhedong Ren, Nemorino (11/8), tenor, earned his BM and MM at China Conservatory of Music, Beijing. Now he's pursuing his PDPL under the guidance of Prof. Arthur Levy and Mr. Joshua Greene at Mannes School of Music. He has performed at the National Stadium, National Center for the Performing Arts, Fujian Minnan Grand Theater, Shandong Provincial Grand Theater, Peking University Centennial Lecture Hall, and so on. As the closing ceremony singer for the 2022 Beijing Winter Olympics, he performed and recorded theme songs for the event. In addition to singing, he also performs as a piano accompanist for singers.

Jason Tramm, Executive Producer/Conductor - Maestro Tramm has been hailed as a "conductor to watch" by Symphony Magazine, "filled with Italianate passion" by the Huffington Post, and an "orchestra Pied Piper" by the New York Concert Review. Maestro Tramm's work in the operatic, symphonic, and choral realms has received critical acclaim throughout the United States and abroad. He holds the following appointments: Executive Director, LONJ, the Director of Music Ministries, Ocean Grove Great Auditorium, Artistic Director, MidAtlantic Artistic Productions, Music Director of both the Taghkanic Chorale and Putnam Chorale, and Principal Guest Conductor of the Long Island Concert Orchestra. Dr. Tramm serves as an Associate Professor and Director of Choral Activities at Seton Hall University, where he conducts the University Chorus, Chamber Choir, and Orchestra. As a guest conductor, he has led symphonic and operatic performances in Italy, Romania, Hungary, Czech Republic throughout the Unites States. He is also the host of Music Matters with Jason Tramm, a podcast that explores artistic innovation under extreme circumstances, as seen through the eyes of distinguished artists. Music Matters can be seen on YouTube and has over 350,000 views.

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
